The Autumn gathering of users of open systems EUROOPEN 2016 will be focused on practical aspects of computer security and applied cryptography. This, rather informal, gathering of experts is organized in order to foster the exchange of information and ideas in the past, ongoing, and also future projects.



The program committee will accept submissions targeting security of mobile devices, malware analysis, network security, applied cryptography, security of smart cards and interesting development approaches in these but also in other relevant areas. The advantage is to focus on open-source systems and practical experience with implementation.

Proposals for presentation should be submitted as an extended abstract of 1-2 pages formatted for anonymous evaluation and sent to svenda@fi.muni.cz no later than *May 27th, 2016*. The expected size of final submission is 2-10 pages but is not strictly limited. The submissions will be later typeset in Latex, but it is not required to adhere to any template in advance.

The submission in English, Czech, and Slovak language are accepted with notification of acceptance / rejection before June 13th, 2016. Authors of accepted papers will be asked for a short annotation and CV used in the promotional brochure.
